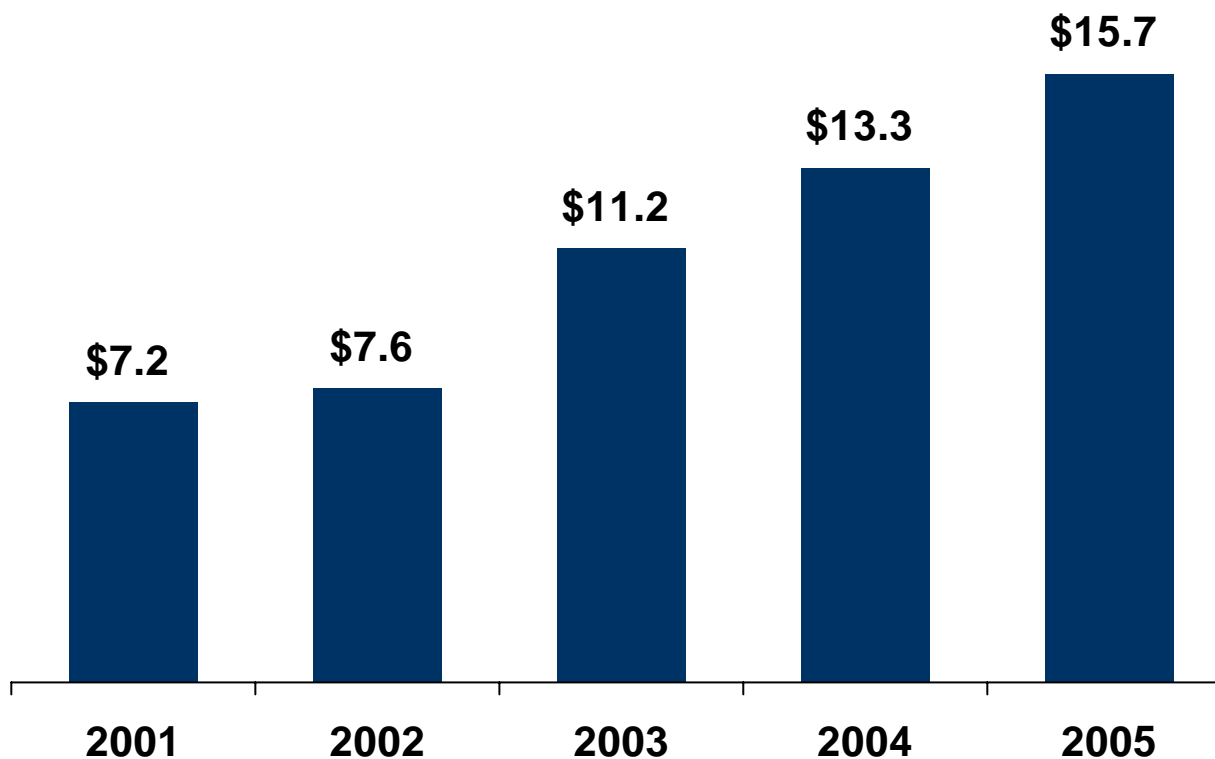

# Total Health ODA Commitments, 2001-2005

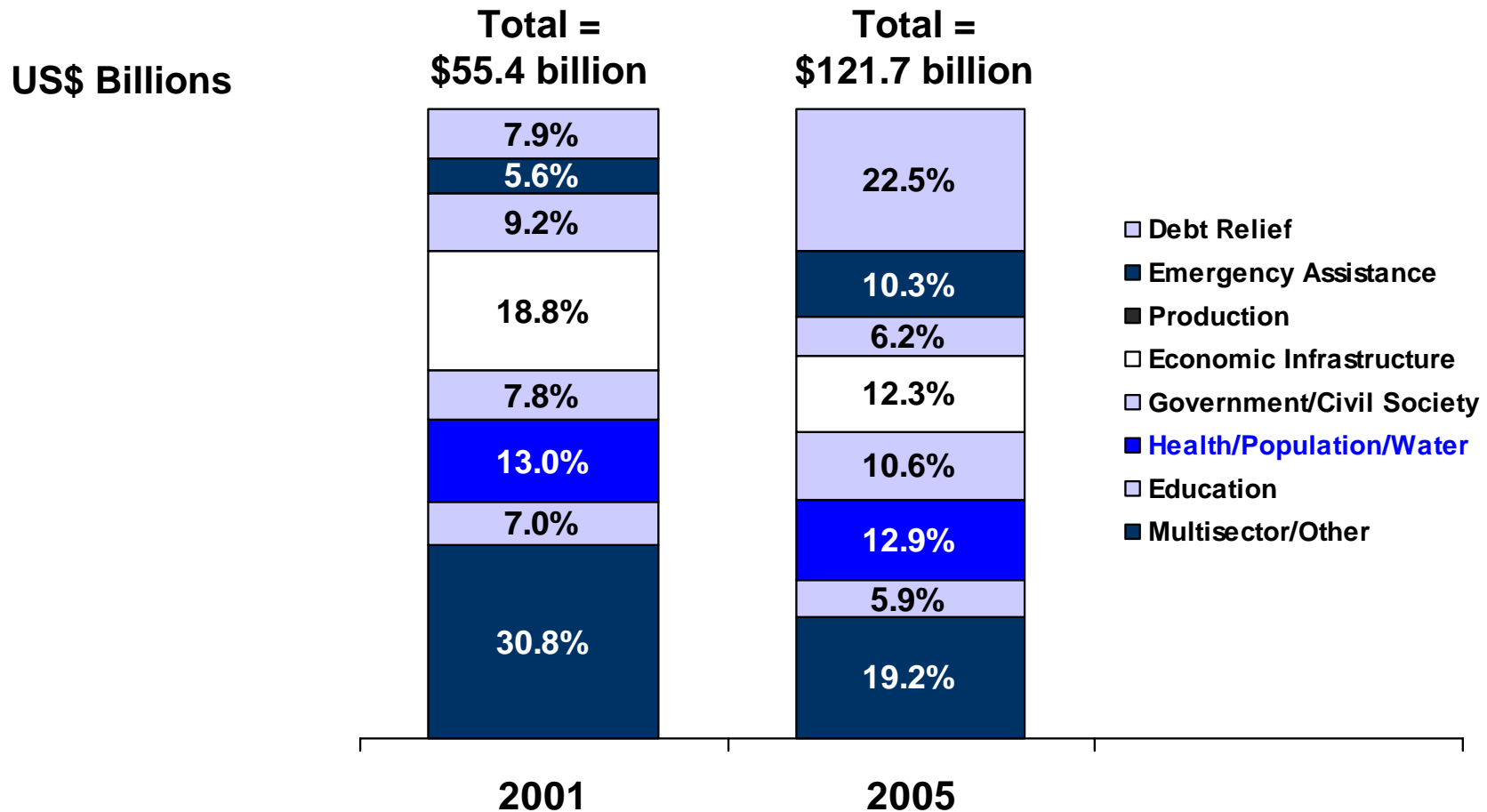

# Share of ODA Commitments by Major Sector, 2001 & 2005

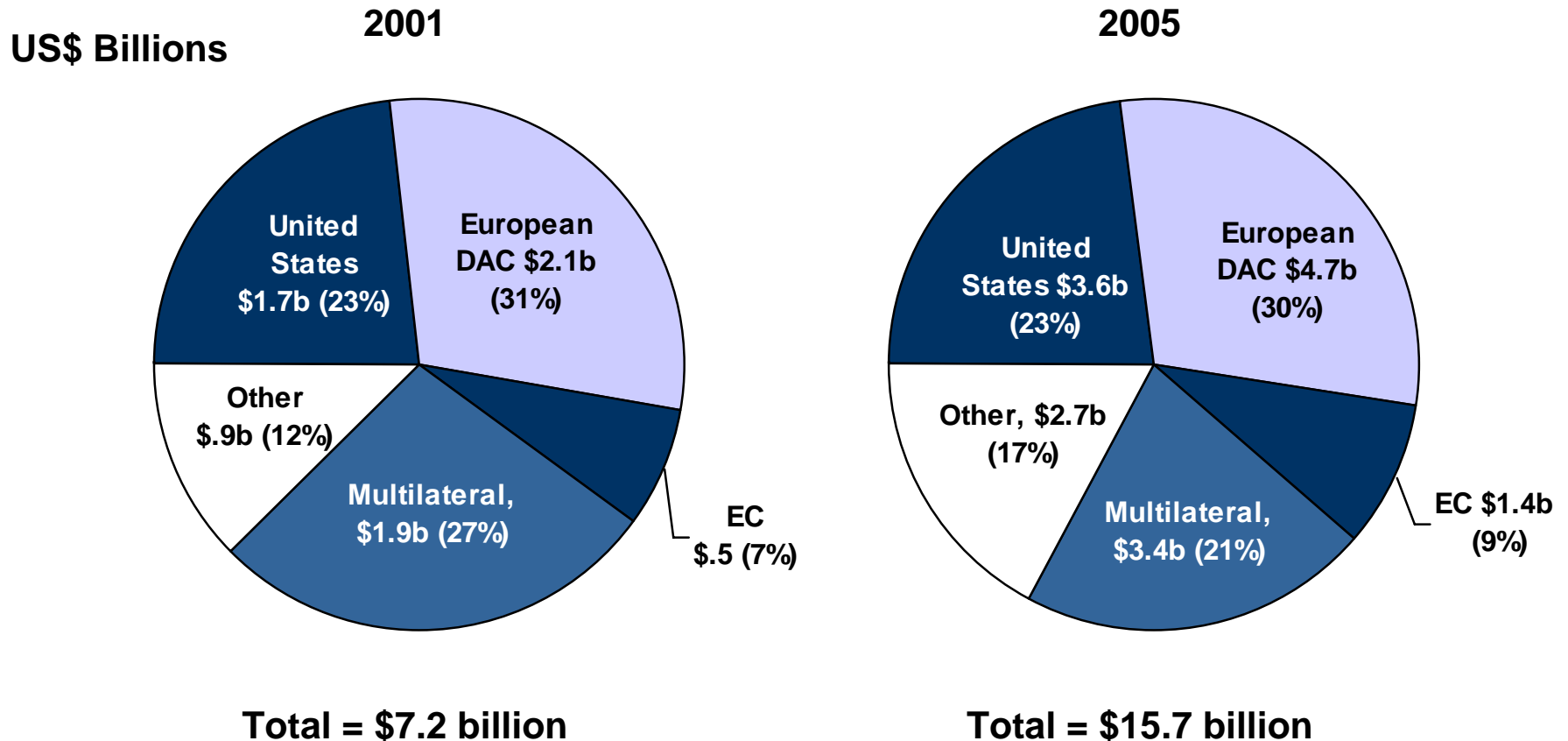

# Health ODA Commitments by Donor, 2001 & 2005

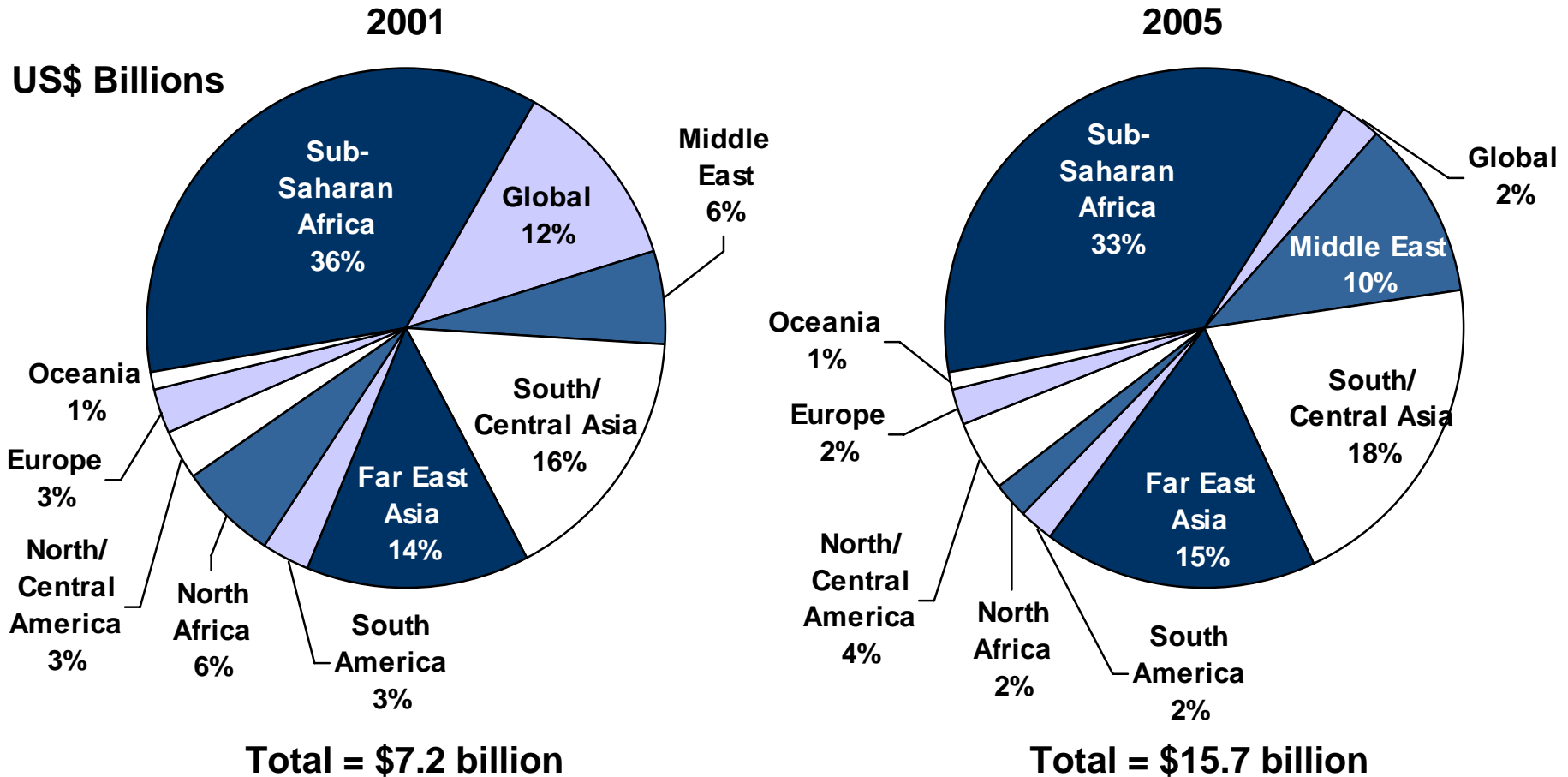

# Health ODA Commitments by Region, 2001 & 2005



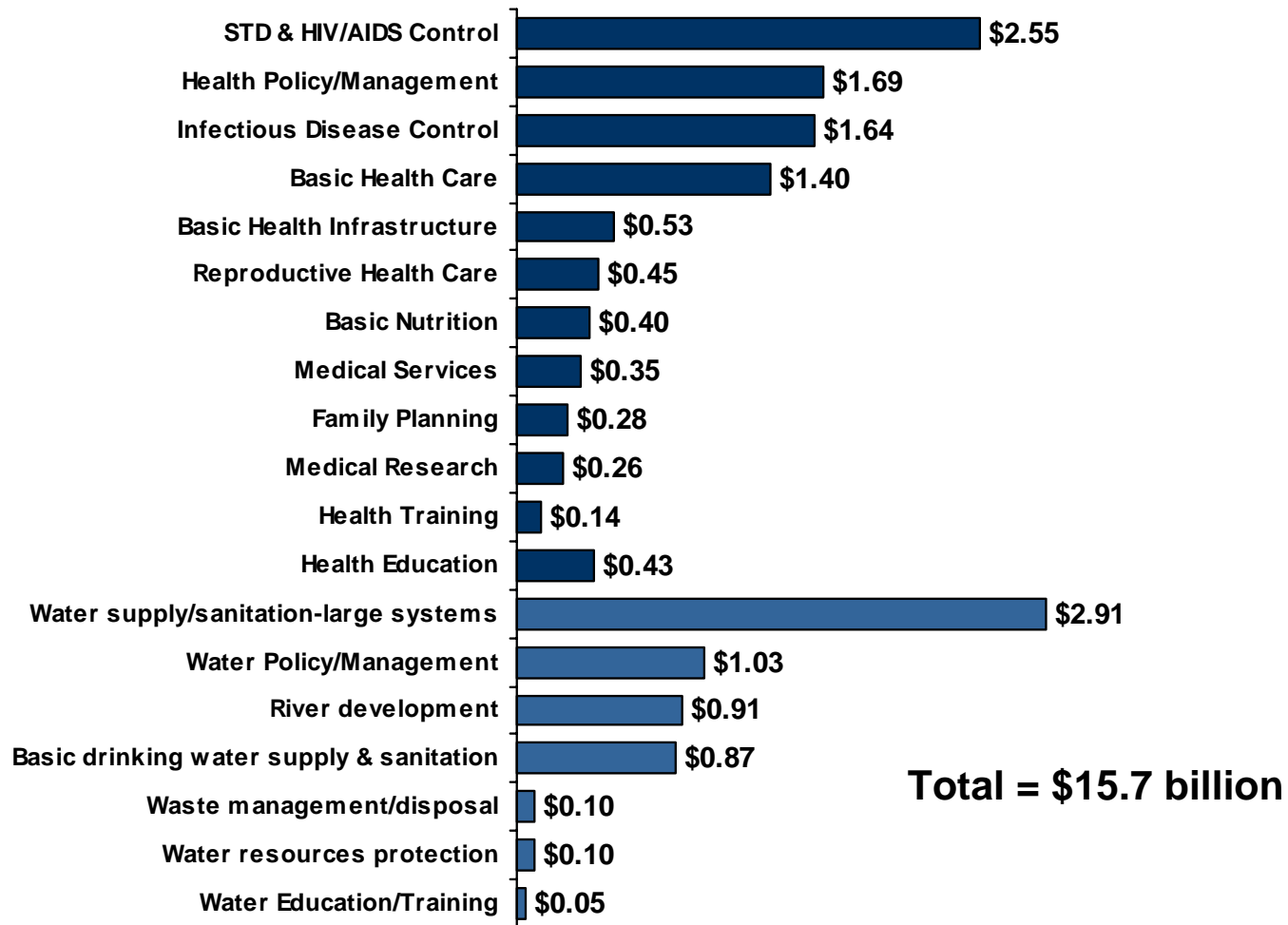

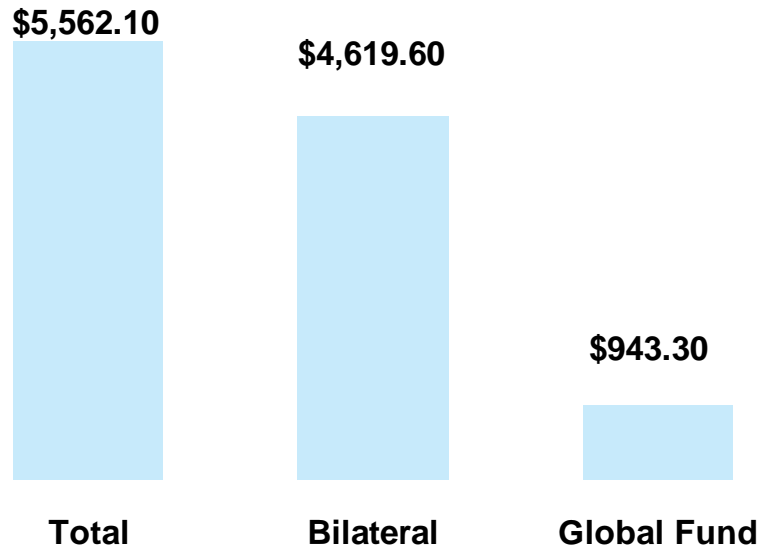

## International AIDS Assistance: G8/EC & Other Donor Government Commitments, 2006

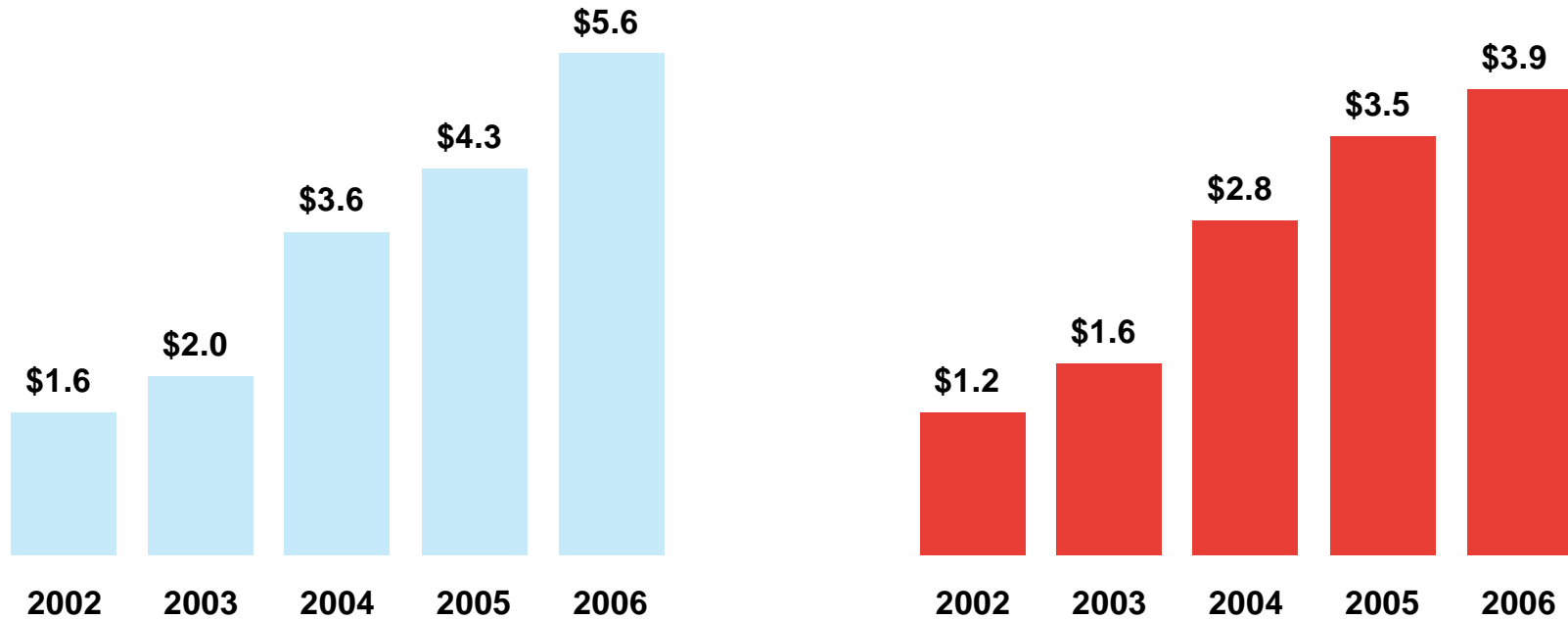

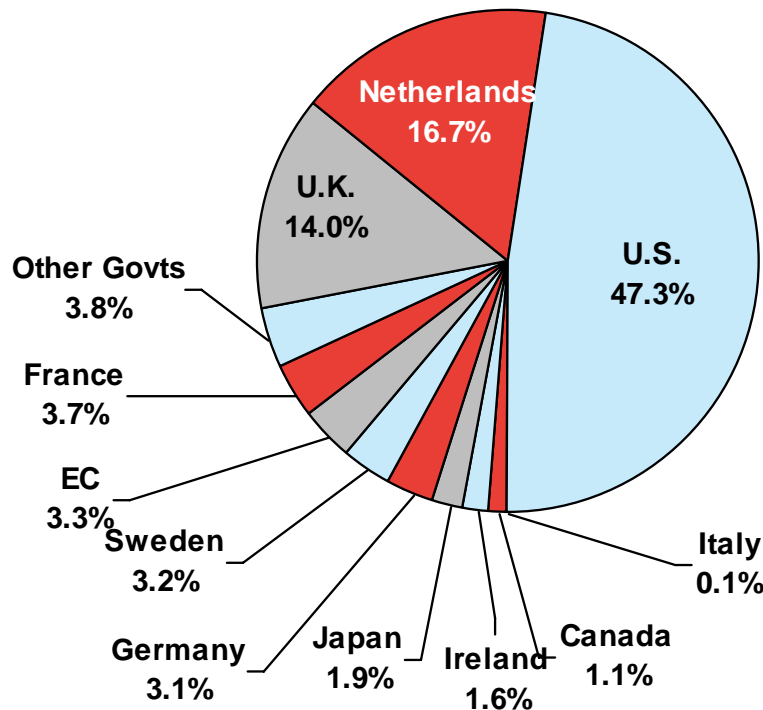

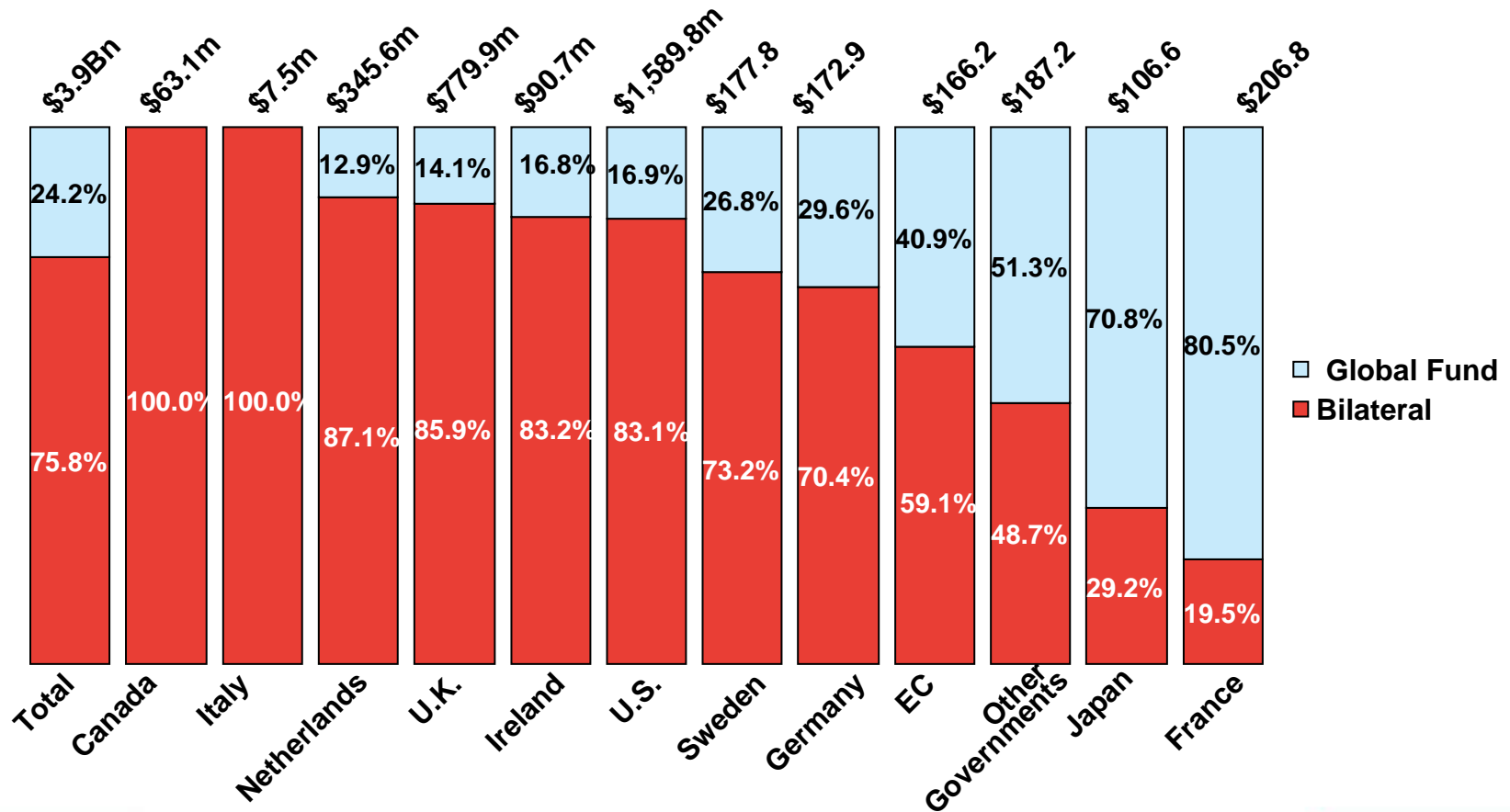
## International AIDS Assistance: G8/EC & Other Donor Governments as Share of Total Donor Government Commitments, 2006

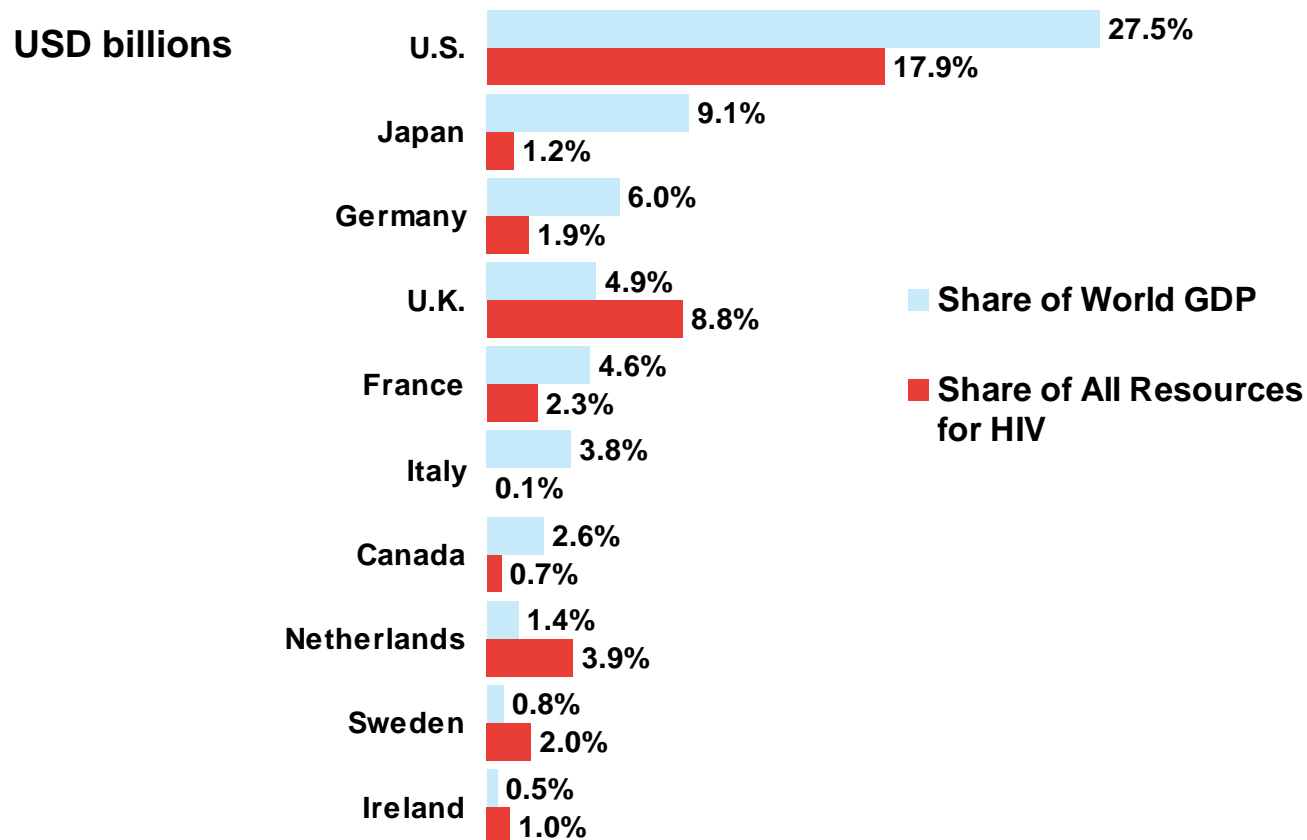

## International AIDS Assistance: G8/EC Funding Channels for Disbursements, 2006



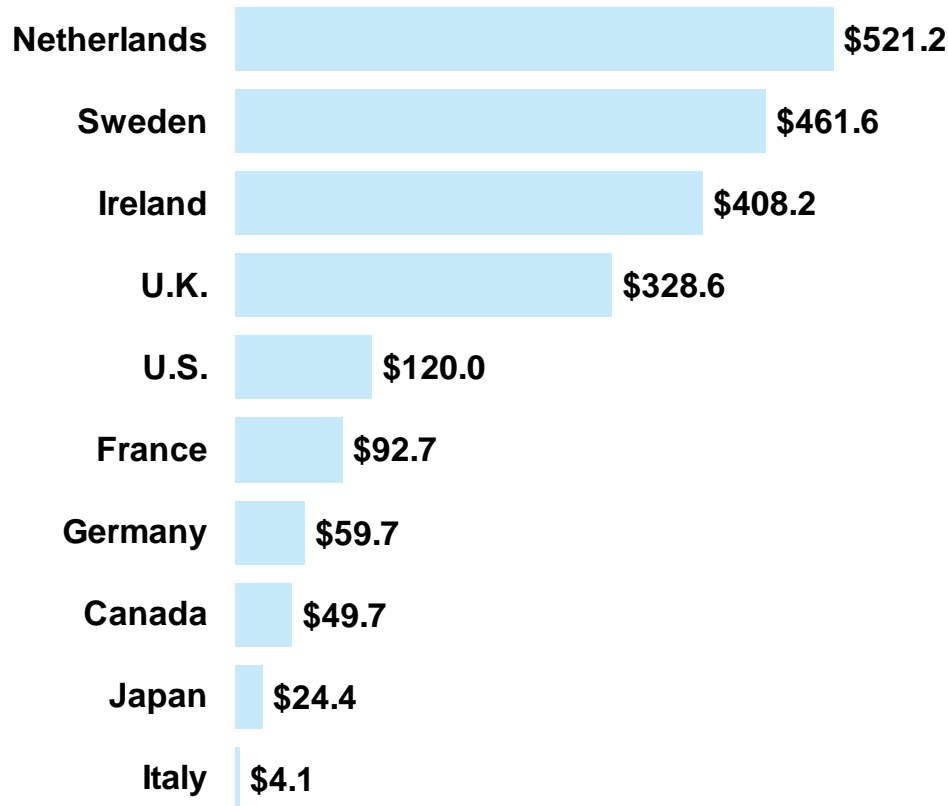
