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**Gary Claxton** is a vice president and the director of the Health Care Marketplace Project at the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation. The project provides information, research, and analysis about trends in the health care market and about policy proposals that relate to health insurance reform and our changing health care system. Before joining the foundation, Mr. Claxton worked as a senior researcher at the Institute for Health Care Research and Policy at Georgetown University, where his research focused on health insurance and health care financing. From March 1997 until January 2001, Mr. Claxton was the deputy assistant secretary for health policy at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, where he advised the Secretary on health policy issues, including improving access to health insurance, Medicare reform, administration of Medicaid, financing of prescription drugs, expanding patient rights, and health care privacy. Other previous positions include serving as a consultant for the Lewin Group, a special deputy in the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation, an insurance analyst for the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, and a health policy analyst for the American Association of Retired Persons.



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**Brian Webb** has worked in health policy in Washington, DC, since 1988, when he joined the office of Rep. Bill Thomas (R-CA) as the health legislative assistant. Mr. Webb served in that capacity when Chairman Thomas first became Ranking Minority Member of the Subcommittee on Health for the Committee on Ways and Means. After six years with Rep. Thomas, Mr. Webb worked for five years in California Gov. Pete Wilson's Washington, DC, office as deputy director and health and welfare aide.

Prior to joining the National Association of Insurance Commissioners as a health policy analyst in 2001, Mr. Webb worked on Medicare and Medicaid policy for the BlueCross BlueShield Association and, before that, was the assistant vice president for legislation for the then-Federation of American Health Systems.



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**Stephen Finan** is a health economist and senior director of policy for the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network, the advocacy affiliate of the American Cancer Society. He oversees all public policy for the two organizations, including efforts related to health care reform.

Previously, he was a senior economist in the Office of Economic Policy in the Department of the Treasury. His responsibilities included a variety of health issues, including health insurance tax credits, public and private insurance issues, health care costs, and tax policy. He was also involved with pension and Social Security reform issues.

Before joining Treasury, Mr. Finan worked in the Departments of Health and Human Services, Labor, and Justice; the Office of Management and Budget; and the office of Sen. David Pryor (D-AR).
